HOW SHALL WE RESPOND THIS WEEK? Second Sunday of Lent

Fasting

-Fast from running away. How might you be running from God or from the commitment/call God has asked of you?

Prayer

-Read Joshua 1 and pray for the courage and strength to go where God sends you even if the road looks difficult.

Around the Kitchen Table

- -What sacrifices in your daily life might you have to make in order to commit fully to God? Are there things you are afraid to let go of or to undertake that you think God might be asking you to do?
- -Have you ever done something you were afraid to do for the sake of service to God or your neighbor? How did God help you overcome that fear? Consider sharing your experiences in an appropriate setting as a testimony of God's work in your life.

Ideas for Including Children and Teens

- -For elementary kids and younger, consider having a sharing time at dinner. When they share a story about being like Jesus, everyone puts a button (or coin or rock etc.) in a jar and you can watch the jar fill up during Lent. During Holy Week, consider bringing out a large jar already filled up as a reminder of what Jesus has already done for us.
- -For middle schoolers and high schoolers, consider deciding together on a service project for Lent. Plan out how it will affect extracurricular activities and talk about what sorts of sacrifices are worth it for living a life of service.
