HOW SHALL WE RESPOND THIS WEEK? Third Sunday of Lent

Fasting

-Fast from comparing yourself to other people—when you find yourself going down mental pathways of comparison, pause and bring that thought to Christ in humility, remembering that you share the image of God with everyone you meet.

Prayer

-Before social interactions, pray this prayer: "God show me your image in every face I see."

Around the Kitchen Table

- -If you haven't already, designate a chair in your home for Christ to figuratively sit in it; a "Christ chair". Now, take some time to imagine different people in your life sitting in that chair—perhaps a coworker you struggle to get along with or a relative that gets under your skin. Remind yourself that they too carry the image of God.
- -Take a turn yourself sitting in the Christ chair. Remember the value that Christ gives your through his love and sacrifice. Remember that you bear his image and his name and are treasured by him, not because of what you've done, but because of what he has done for you.

Ideas for Including Children and Teens

-Have children and teens take turns sitting in the Christ chair and have other family members affirm the image of God in them and tell them of ways they see Christ at work in them.
